Let's Get Started!

Project ID Field

Each Enterprise Project Type allows you to customize the Project ID:

Project Id

Generate a project ID for all projects created from the EPT. This will help with quickly identifying a project and being able to search for it.

Prefix:

Starting Number: *

Postfix:

Minimum Digit Padding *

This would allow you to group projects, categorically, by these IDs. You also could add either a prefix or a suffix to indicate whether a project was in Idea phase or not.

Project ID Field

You can also make this field available on Project Detail pages by editing the page and adding it.

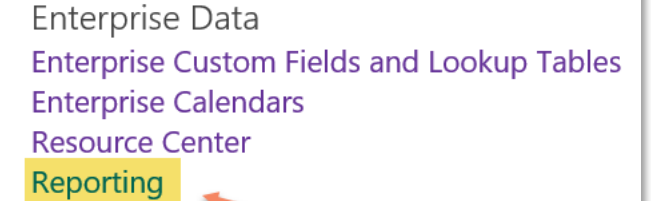

From PWA settings, Enterprise Data: Reporting

Our recommendation: Daily

Timephased Data

Choose the level of granularity that the timephased data will be generated.

Important: Each project needs to be published to reflect any changes in options. The Timesheets reporting endpoints are not affected.

Never

Daily

Weekly

Weekly timephased data will use the [Regional Site Settings](#) definitions of:

- First day of the week
- First week of the year

Important: If you change the first day of the week or year after projects have been published using the weekly option, you will need to republish all projects.

Monthly

By fiscal period

By fiscal period timephased data will use the fiscal periods defined in the [Fiscal Periods](#) section.

Important: Reporting data will only be generated for defined fiscal periods. Also, if you change an existing fiscal period, you will need to republish all projects.

Project Reporting Settings

Understand the Impact:

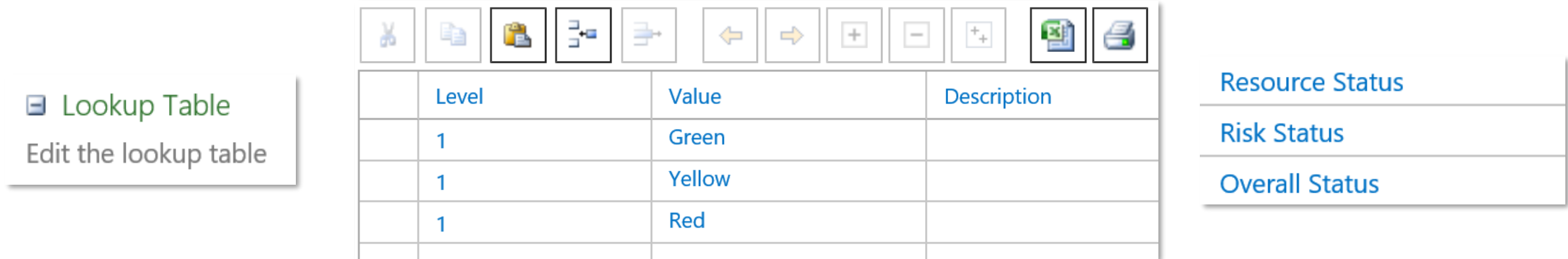

This was designed as a benefit for performance, but could have a negative impact if not realized.

It only occurs on new PWA environments. It won't automatically change on your already-configured environment!

Incorporating Graphical Indicators

Showing Graphical Indicators in Power BI starts by creating fields that will hold those values.

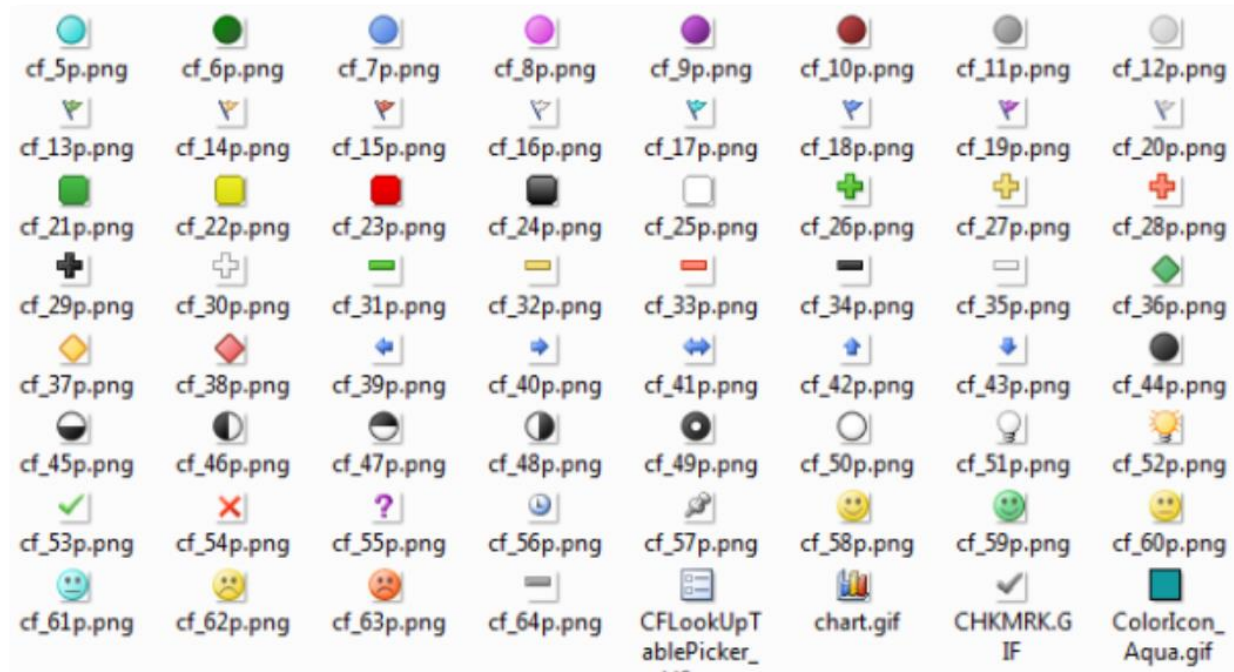

You'll create a status lookup table first, then pull that Project Level field into Power BI.

Incorporating Graphical Indicators

This allows you to represent the Status values you create (or the absence of values) both in Power BI and in Project Center.

Embed Power BI Reports into Project Sites

- One location for reports – on your main PWA site
- Easy access for Executives with a link they already know
- Automatically updated when report is updated

Requirements:

- Modern Pages enabled
- Permission and knowledge on creating and editing Site Pages
- A desire to make something really cool ;)
